Play by the rules

We are playing games. Games are only fun if everyone plays by the same rules. A player who consistently ignores the rules will be asked to sit out until they are ready to play fair.

Yes and (Agreement)

Whenever players are on stage they agree with each other and forward each others ideas. For example If player A says "Hi I'm from Mars," and Player B says "No you're not," the scene goes nowhere. If instead Player B accepts player A's initiation and then forwards it (Oh good, I'm from Pluto and I'm a little lost."), the scene can go an infinite number of places.

Any idea is a good idea

There are no right or wrong answers. And you don't even need to have an idea you can just walk onstage and see what happens.

Anyone can do it

You don't need to have "talent" or any acting experience to be a good improviser. The big trick is to listen as much as you can to your fellow players and build on their ideas.

Keep your focus on the players

When you are onstage/playing a game your attention should be on your fellow players. When you are watching/being audience your attention should be on the players. We will want to know what you observed while you were watching.

Brown Bag Fouls

Toilet humor lacks creativity. In ComedySportz if audience members make crude suggestions, they get a "Brown Bag Foul," and have to sit in the audience with a brown paper bag over their head. We won't be putting paper bags on anyones head! But, Brown Bag Fouls are not allowed in workshop. If a player repeatedly makes crude jokes they may have to sit out for a bit.

Being Audience

Full participation is expected, however if someone is feeling very fearful they can choose to be audience (instead of actor/player). When you are being audience you are participating by staying focused on what's happening, observing closely and sharing what you notice.
